



RECEPTION CURRICULUM OVERVIEW



SPRING TFRM 2022—2023

- Travel with confidence and skills around, over, under balancing and climbing equipment
- Practices some appropriate safety measures without direct supervision.
- Shows some understanding that good practices, with regards to exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene can contribute to good health.
- Uses a pencil and holds it effectively to form recognisable letters, most of which are formed correctly.
- Shows understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges and considers and manages some risks.



Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- Can describe self in positive terms and talk about abilities.
- Explains own knowledge and understanding and asks appropriate questions of others.
- They work as part of a group or class, understand and follow the rules.
- They say when they do and don't need help.
- They adjust their behaviour to different situations, and take changes of routine in their stride.



Communication & Language

- Responds to instructions involving a two-part sequence.
- Understands humour e.g. nonsense rhymes and jokes.
- Extends vocabulary especially by grouping and naming, exploring the meaning and sounds of new words.
- They give their attention to what others say and respond appropriately, while engaged in another activity.

Maths

- Estimates how many objects they can see and checks by counting them.
- Finds one more and one less of five/ten objects.
- Finds the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them.
- In practical activities and discussions, begins to use the vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting.
- Begins to use the mathematical term for 3D shapes and mathematical terms to describe
- Orders items by length, height, weight and capacity.
- Measures short periods of time in simple ways.



Expressive Arts & Design

- Explores what happens when you mix colours.
- They safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.
- Constructs with a purpose in mind using a variety of resources.
- Selects resources and adapts work when necessary.
- Select and safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.

Literacy

- Begins to read words and simple sentences
- They use phonic knowledge to de code regular words and read them aloud accurately.
- They also read some common irregular words.
- Enjoys an increasing range of books.
- Uses some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning,
- They also write some irregular common words.
- Children use their phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds.

Understanding the World

- Children talk about past and present events in their own life and those of family members
- Children recognise that a range of technology is used in homes and schools.
- Children know about similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things.
- Looks closely at similarities, differences, pattern and change.
